The Tanque Verde Valley Association (TVVA) has been in continuous existence since its incorporation in 1947. The TVVA is the oldest and largest organization of its type in Pima County.

The TVVA has been very active in supporting the community and providing a unified voice on a variety of issues. The Board of the TVVA works extensively with local elected officials, law enforcement, and fire personnel in support of our stated purpose.

Maintaining the SR (Low Density) zoning in areas surrounding Saguaro National Park.




Maintaining the established zoning in the Tanque Verde Valley.

The TVVA boundaries are the Catalina Mountains and the Coronado National Forest on the North, the Rincon Mountains and Saguaro National Park on the East, Irvington Road to the South, and Pantano Road to the West. The TVVA voices community-wide concerns and offer support to organizations and areas with similar goals which lie inside and outside our boundaries.



The TVVA bylaws state: "The purpose of this association shall be to further and guide the orderly development of the area, to uphold zoning codes set forth in the Rincon Area Plan and in the Agua Caliente - Sabino Creek Neighborhood Plan, and to preserve or improve the inherent scenic and ecological characteristics of the area."



The TVVA is a non-profit organization with no political affiliations or loyalties. Annual meetings are free and open to the public. The Board of Directors holds open meetings monthly and encourages local

residents with community concerns to attend. Board members are volunteers who reside within our boundaries, are elected at our annual general meeting, and serve for a period of two years.



The TVVA's large membership and over half a century of experience in representing the interests of the Tanque Verde Valley community enable the TVVA to quickly and effectively mobilize to address problems and work towards solutions. The TVVA functions within and for the community on issues as simple as resolving poor road conditions and as far reaching as inappropriate area zoning changes.

Neighborhoods regularly call upon the TVVA and its broader community base when they feel the need for a more powerful voice in representing their local concerns. The TVVA exists for the purpose of offering that unified voice on issues which impact our community and our valley. Recently the TVVA updated their website and initiated an email newsletter to keep members and community more informed.
